- EMACS
- vi

- Move to SunOS 1990
 - EMACS
 - Evil
- Decided to write my own editor based on XEDIT
 Chose curses as UI for portability

• 1990 - 1992 – Personal development

SunOS using BSD curses

• DOS and OS/2 using PDCurses

16 Aug 1992 – v1.0 – First Public release

 DOS and OS/2 binaries: SIMTEL and comp.binaries.os2

- 17 May 1993 v1.1
 - Lots of new commands
 - First prefix commands
 - Added features from KEDIT
 - Added Rexx support on OS/2 and Unix (with Regina)

- 1 Dec 1993 v1.5
 - Lots bug fixes
 - Support neurses under Linux
 - Rexx support under DOS (386 or above required)new commands
 - Prefix macros can now be executed. Thanks to Dave Rittenhouse

• 26 Jan 1995 – v2.0

- Major rewrite of screen handling
- Support AIX Extended Curses under AIX
- Full colour support under all platforms
- SET COMPAT to mimic default behaviour of XEDIT or KEDIT
- ALL command added

- 26 May 1996 v2.2
 - Native X11 version (PDCurses)
 - Separate window
 - Mouse support
 - Support Rexx/imc and Rexx/6000 where available
 - More documentation

• 17 Dec 1996 – v2.3

- Native Windows version (PDCurses)
 - Separate window
 - Mouse support
- Support Rexx/imc and Rexx/6000 where available
- More documentation

• 30 Jun 1998 – v2.5

- Performance improvements around memory management
- Autosave files on Linux crash suggested by Ian Collier
- Support Object Rexx, Personal Rexx, Enterprise Rexx and uni-REXX on Win95/NT
- Support uni-REXX on Unix
- Shareware package THEdit released by InterSoft – 16bit native Windows

- 31 Jul 1999 v2.8
 - Clipboard support on Win32, OS/2 ad X121 ports
 - Mouse support on neurses
 - THE ported to QNX

16 Jan 2000 – v3.0

• Syntax highlighting added based on Kedit

• 16 Jan 2000 – v3.1

- Support for regex in ALL and LOCATE commands
- Single window mode in X11 to open file in existing THE window
- Add support for Rexx/Trans
- Additional platforms; Amiga, BeOS, AtheOS, Linux/390 and Mac OSX
- Initial SET COMPAT ISPF

• No formal release date – v3.3

- Bug fixes and feature requests
- Support ooRexx 4.x
- Mac OSX native app supports drag/drop
- Introduced a THE "launcher" which can run different UI variants
- Mouse scroll wheel support
- Started UTF8 support still not complete

• Coming soon – v3.4

- Bug fixes and feature requests
- Support ooRexx 4.x
- Added SDL1, SDL2, VT variants
- PDCursesMod code now included with THE source. This enables THE to be packaged


 Added remote the macro to enable editing files on remote servers. Requires Rexx/CURL and PKI support on remote server

2005 relinquished maintainer of PDCurses




